

About Mountaineer Food Bank

Mountaineer Food Bank (MFB), a member of Feeding America, believes in a West Virginia where no one goes to bed hungry...today or tomorrow. The Food Bank is the largest emergency food provider in West Virginia, serving families, children, seniors, veterans, and individuals at risk of hunger.

Annually, MFB distributes over 19 million meals to food-insecure neighbors in 48 of the 55 counties. We are led by our mission to feed West Virginia's hungry and empower communities to end hunger.

Over 200,000 individuals in West Virginia are considered food insecure, meaning they lack consistent access to enough nutritious food to fuel a healthy life. In order to address this issue, Mountaineer Food Bank distributes food and other essentials to those in need through a network of more than 460 community partners. In addition, we also provide programs and services aimed at helping families and individuals at risk of hunger. These programs include the Mobile Pantry Program, Veterans Table Program, Child Hunger Programs, Senior Feeding Programs, Food for Health, and more.

Our work this year would not have been made possible without the support of our amazing donors. We are still in awe of the generosity and support we received throughout the year, and will never be able to fully explain how much we appreciate every single donation, big or small.

The support we received helped us through another busy year, as we continued facing an increased need due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. In 2021, our donor's contributions helped us distribute over 23 million pounds of food, which means we served 19.4 million meals to communities across our 48 county service area. We truly couldn't have done it without all the support we received. This support was vital to thousands of children, families, and seniors across the state.

As we look toward the new year ahead of us, we're also looking back at some of our accomplishments this year.

This past year has been one of great success. From new education initiatives and expanded resources to fresh produce for kids and families, so many people have been given something to be grateful for.

We launched our Feeding Families Prime Program this past year, focusing on a holistic approach to addressing food insecurity. Instead of providing one box of food, we partnered with various organizations to provide nutritional resources, recipes, and other helpful tips to help those we serve make sustainable lifestyle changes.

We also launched our RX Program, which provides fresh food and recipes to individuals with pre-existing medical conditions such as heart disease, diabetes, and obesity. Expanding on our fresh food initiatives, we partnered with Turnrow Appalachian Farm Collective to provide more fresh produce to those we serve.

Again, these accomplishments wouldn't have been made possible without all our donor's kindness and support. We know there's plenty more work to do in 2022, but we are comforted knowing we have so many who support our mission.





COVID-19 RESPONSE | ANUARY 1-DECEMBER 31, 2021

As the COVID-19 pandemic continued throughout 2021, the number of West Virginians struggling with food insecurity steadily increased. Mountaineer Food Bank rose to the challenge by hosting **307 mobile food pantries** throughout its 48-county service area, feeding thousands of families in need.

Mobile Food Pantries

Mobile food pantries provide food to "food deserts" where food accessibility is limited and/or scarce. Each mobile pantry feeds between **150-450 households.** Every family receives fresh produce, protein, dairy product and shelf-stable foods to help sustain them throughout the month.
